Don't Forget ... It'sTime to Order Bees

It is time to think about your bee order for next bee year. Once again Tillamook Beekeepers and Central Coast Beekeepers will be doing a joint bee order with the bees coming from local suppliers. I need to know at our January meeting who wants bees and how many nucs and packages you want. I know this is difficult to do in January, but Bob Allen with the Tillamook Bee Club, needs numbers when he contacts our suppliers. I encourage you to overestimate your order as we can always reduce the number of packages and nucs but our initial order is the maximum we can get. Bob and I will most likely be unable to accommodate additional requests for packages and nucs after January.

This year you will again be able to order five frame nucleus hives (nucs) and/or four (4) pound packages. Both the nucs and the packages come with Carniolan queens the same as last year.

Bob and I were told last year that prices will be going up this year. I will not know the actual prices until March but last year packages were \$81.00 and Nucs were \$91.00 with a five (\$5.00) dollar handling fee (which will stay the same) for each order. You can expect pickup to be the first or second week of April. Pickup will be at my house in Lincoln City.

You must be a member of either Central Coast Beekeepers or Tillamook Beekeepers to order through our club. That is a requirement of the suppliers. Even with the cost of membership you are still getting a great price. The suppliers are doing this as a service to the clubs to encourage membership in the regional Bee Clubs.

So at our January meeting: I need to know how many packages and nucs you want to order for next bee year.
